We meet on a monthly basis. Our team consists of members from the office, shop, and management. We monitor all aspects of our operations from recycling to end of shift equipment shutdowns and energy usage at our facility.

✓ Recycling

We recycle paper, plastic, glass etc. We also recycle any scrap metal leftover from a job run such as steel and stainless steel.

✓ Hazardous Waste/Toxic Use Reduction

Our company has a fully contained system for our passivation and polishing system. The water used in this system is pumped thru cation and anion tanks for filtering and when the tanks become spent, they are then taken for cleaning and recharging. Other oils and solvents are collected into steel drums and then picked up by a facility for decontamination and disposal.

☑ Energy Efficiency

We have repaired the gasket on one of our large ovens and have also saved \$1,469.00 annually by repairing compressed air leaks. We have replaced lighting in the shop allowing for 25% less kilowatt hour usage.
