## Management and Leadership

### Environmentally Preferable Purchasing

*Part of the Co-op’s mission is to make healthy food and knowledge of that food accessible. To that end, the Co-op has introduced a [food attributes key](#) to provide information on the various attributes (organic, local, fairly-traded, etc.) of the foods we offer.*

## Waste

### Solid Waste Reduction and Reuse

1. *Our Take A Bag, Leave A Bag Program is available outside the entry to the store.  
- Customers can take a reusable bag and leave one for others to use for their*

*shopping trips, cutting back on the number of paper bags used by customers.*

2. *New owners receive a free reusable bag when they sign up.*
3. *We offer sturdy paper bags and reusable plastic bags at checkout for customers who do not have a reusable bag. Both bags are also recyclable.*
4. *Our Bring-A-Bag Program encourages customers to bring their own reusable bag because for every bag they bring, they receive a token to donate 5 cents to a charity of their choice upon exiting the store.*
  - *To date, we have donated \$180,672 to local non-profits.*
  - *The Bring-A-Bag Program has also saved 269,717 bags from the landfill.*
5. *We have a standing container in our exit vestibule for consistent donations to the local food bank, where customers may drop off donations.*
6. *For food that is nearing its expiration date, we have weekly donation pick-ups from the local food banks. This reduces waste and feeds those in need of a healthy meal.*

#### **Recycling**

1. *We have recycled a total of 397 tons since 2009.*
2. *We partner with Terracycle, to assist in recycling certain products that were previously deemed unrecyclable.*
3. *We bale cardboard used from stocking the store, averaging about 168,000 pounds per year.*
4. *We offer ink cartridge and small electronic recycling.*
